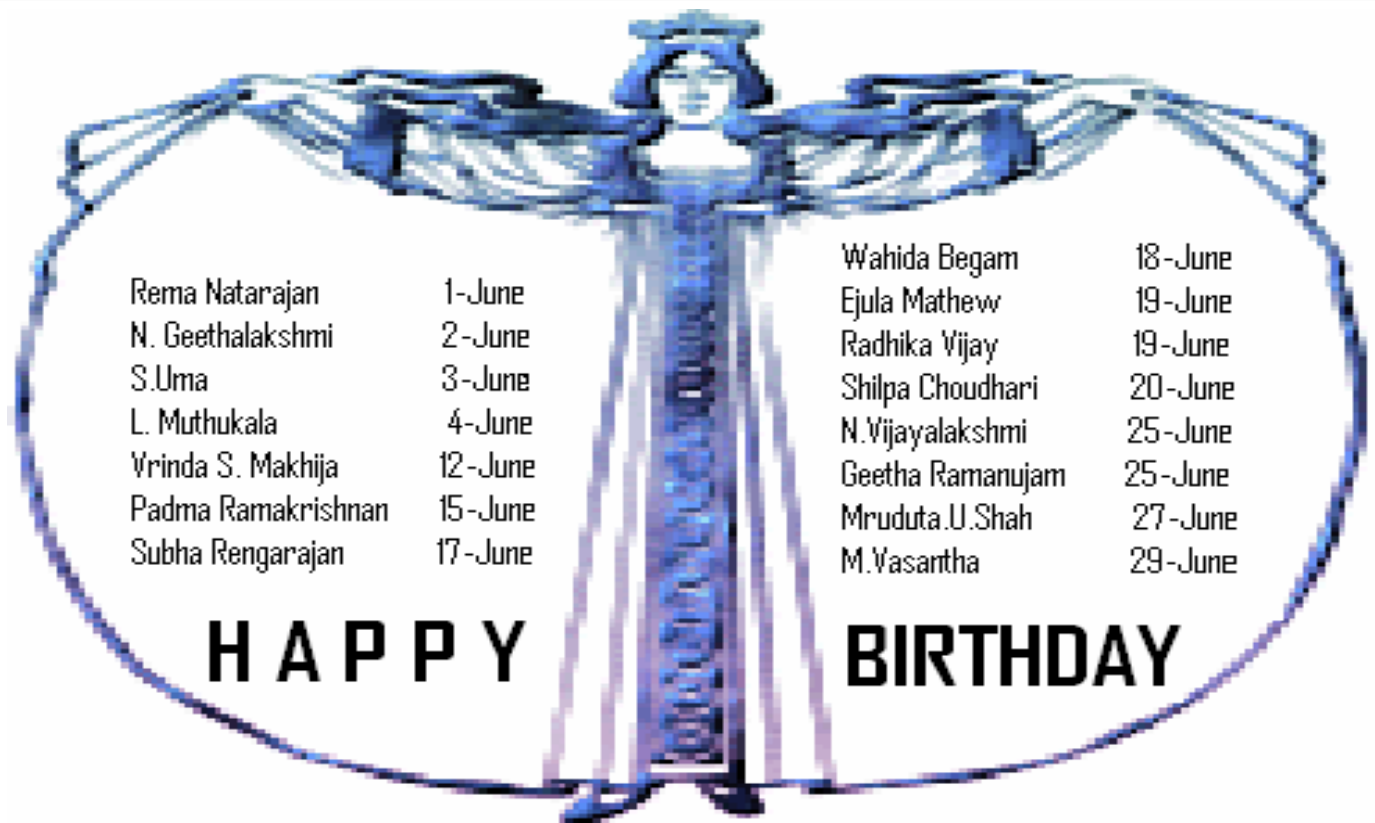
**Career Choice -
